Priest's Ponderings

You can confidently take it that the Holy Eucharist is a testimony that believers form one body with Christ, so that everything which is his, they may call their own. We can therefore be totally assured that eternal life, of which he himself is the author and inheritor, is also ours, and that the kingdom of heaven, into which he has entered, can no more be taken from us than from him.
