How can you turn that into action on behalf of God so that the world can be turned into a better place?




Pray for the discernment to know which of the world's evils to address and how you might go about that in God's name.

Today Taree's Anglican parish church celebrates our patron saint; John the Apostle & Evangelist or John the Divine, (the word "divine" in this sense means a teacher of the Faith or theologian). Incidentally, the largest cathedral in the world, (the Episcopal, i.e., Anglican Cathedral in New York City) is also under the patronage of Saint John the Divine. So, we are in distinguished company!

St. John was the youngest of the Apostles and hence, in Christian art, is often depicted without a beard to indicate the young age at which he became a follower of Jesus. He was the only one of the 12 Apostles not to be martyred for the Faith. Please remember in your prayers the young people of Manning Valley Anglican College who are preparing to be confirmed in St John's Church on 23rd May, that like our patron saint, they too, may be lifelong followers of Jesus.

Today is also Mother's Day. I am sure we are all deeply grateful to God for the love, care and godly guidance we received from our mothers- I know I certainly am. The ultimate example of motherhood for Christians is the Blessed Virgin Mary.
