The Psalmist, writing of God, tells us, From you springs my praise in the great congregation: I will pay my vows in the sight of all that fear you.


Clearly he felt empowered by the worship of God in the company of others. How does worship add toy your life? What does it empower you to do for others?

Priest's Ponderings

The Queen of Sheba met King Solomon (1 Kings 10:) and that's how come Jews are in Ethiopia. From Addis Ababa to Jerusalem is 4,000 Km.. If you were a court official, you wouldn't do the trip on a chariot. It would likely be a caravan – a slow-moving, four wheel stateroom for a Nine-month round trip. Explains why Philip gets on board so easily, why passengers are comfortable reading scrolls aloud and a stop for water is no problem.

If you visit the Israel Museum in Jerusalem there is a scroll of Isaiah from 200 BC. discovered in 1947. The message is the same: "Christ died for our sins and rose again to set us right." It changed the Ethiopian's life and Two Thousand years later we still have the Ethiopian Orthodox Church. It's a little different, but that's understandable. They weren't founded by an Apostle. No catechism, no ordination, no liturgy.

Just "faith comes by hearing and hearing by the Word of God". The simple message of the Bible, even without the Four Gospels and the letters of Paul, is the rock from which the Holy Spirit springs upon the open mind and infects it with the Word Made Flesh: the risen and ascended Jesus.

"Let this mind be in you, which was also in Christ Jesus".
