Fourth Sunday after Pentecost – Sunday 20 June 2021

1 Samuel 17: 32-49; Psalm 9: 9-20; 2 Corinthians 6.1-13; Mark 4.35-41

Today the Psalmist reminds us again of the love which God has for the poor: [God] has remembered the poor: he has not forgotten their cry ... the needy shall not always be forgotten: nor shall the hope of the poor perish for ever. Given that the poor claim a special place in the heart of God, how can we best help the poor here in Australia, and throughout our Partner Churches?

Priest's Ponderings

Our Gospel reading today is about storms, storms of life.

By rousing Jesus to secure his prayers may have reminded the disciples of Jonah 1: 5-6, but Jesus appears quite different from Jonah here. In Jewish tradition, the one who ruled the wind and sea was God himself and so the disciples are surprised at Jesus' power. Storms rose suddenly on the Sea of Galilee. Fishermen stayed close to the shoreline and were prepared for such squalls. But here, Jesus is asleep in the stern. With the storm subdued, Jesus questions the disciples about their fear and lack of faith. Had they sufficient faith, they would not have given in to such fear.

Our mission is to win people ('fish') for the Kingdom and we must go out into the world. This story puts us in the boat with Jesus and to God who saves through and beyond death, but not necessarily from it.
