Nominations for Positions of Wardens and Parish Council will be open soon.



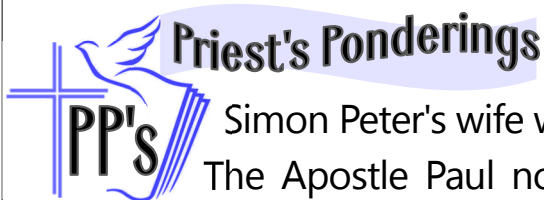
EPIPHANY 5 - SUNDAY 7 FEBRUARY 2021

Isaiah 40.21-31; Psalm 147.1-11; 1 Corinthians 9.16-23; Mark 1.29-39

Paul is a chameleon. He is a Jew but is now a follower of Christ. Nonetheless, he is all things for all people. He is like a Jew, one under the law, one outside the law, and the weak. In fact, Paul will turn himself into anything to save souls. And the best part is that salvation is free. The grace of God in Jesus Christ is there in all Jesus' healings and castings out of demons and it costs nothing. In one sense. But in another the cost to us is the call to leave all of this world behind and follow Jesus.

The Apostle Paul noted (I Corinthians 9:5) that Peter and his wife traveled together. This was one regular family man.

Among the many anonymous women of the Bible is Maya's Mum.

When the locals get wind of her cure, they scarcely suffer the sun to set on the Sabbath before assembling the sick and stricken to seek therapy through the Messiah.

This wasn't why he was born ! Jesus retreats into the gathering dusk. Where's Jesus ? He's focused on the main game: "The time is right. The Kingdom of Heaven is on hand. Change direction ! Believe the good news."

Even to this day, we follow Jesus on the way of the Cross, protesting: "Why me ?"

And he says: *"You did not choose me, but I chose you and appointed you to go and bear fruit ..."*(John 15:16)
