After a long period of yearning, her trust in God and her fervent prayer have been rewarded.

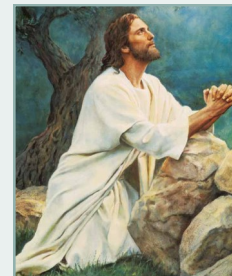


Give thanks for Hannah's faith and trust in God and for her example of steadfast faith and persistent prayer.
