# PP's 19th September

Do we have the same pain the disciples had when we lose status and honour as the disciples in today's gospel. Jesus begins his journey to Jerusalem. He passed through Galilee to concentrate on what is now his chief task: to instruction of his disciples. The disciples are still impervious to the truth that he is the 'Son of Man', to be killed and rise again in three days. Part of this has been the argument they had about who is the greatest. Nothing could run more counter to what Jesus had been attempting to teach them, hence their guilt and half-knowledge when Jesus Questions them.

Jesus sits down (a posture of teaching), summons them and lays down the principle of leadership in his community, 'the one who would be first must be last of all and a servant'. Jesus takes a child, wraps his arms around the child and says, 'Whoever welcomes one such child in my name welcomes me, and whoever welcomes me, welcomes not me but the One who sent me'. To grasp this action, we have to put aside our thoughts of children as such.

Jesus is saying all of us must put aside ideas of self-importance, and that we as disciples must 'practice' this. By doing this, we are welcoming him and the One who sent him. This is one of service. The pain that goes with the loss of status and honour is perhaps akin to that experienced by the disciples as they struggled both to hear and to resist what he was saying. Like them, we are all in the way to Jerusalem with Jesus.
