What are Angels??

Angels are mentioned throughout the bible in various forms both individually and together. The descriptions are various, and they are open to interpretation.

In Ezekiel 1.5-8 we are told about creatures in human form but with four faces and our wings and they sparkled like burnished bronze.....

Isaiah 6:2 offers a different vision of Seraphs (Angels) that had six wings: with two they covered their faces, and with two they covered their feet, and with two they flew.

What is apparent is that Angels are an important part of our faith and represent an understanding and link between us. They herald God's love offering hope and light to darker times and representing the best in all of us.

We see angels in many forms, throughout our community and they are often embraced by people who have no clear understanding of God. Perhaps in this way Angels continue to open the gates of heaven as it says in John 1:51:

'Very truly, I tell you, you will see heaven opened and the angels of God ascending and descending upon the Son of Man.'
