TPP's 29th August

Here we are in the middle of a Pandemic, many of us struggle with the possible repercussions of a virus that threatens our very existence. So, I have to say as I read through this week's Gospel from Mark (Mk. 7-8, 14-23) I could not help but find some amusement in a reading that talks about the issue of handwashing. It highlights the importance of cleanliness to the Pharisees and the Jews, probably for good reasons relating to the avoidance of many germs that were and are the unseen enemy.

Jesus then points out that it is the things that come out of a person that can defile and it is from within that those evil intentions come.

This story is a parable in itself, and we all know that we still need to wash our hands. But we also need to be mindful of maintaining a sense of cleanliness in our inner selves. As many of us become a little frayed during this challenging time this is perhaps a good time for us to remember to think about what comes from within us.

Even in our separation we are able to care for one another and share God's love, it is in that we will find God's Grace.

Song of Songs 2.8-13; Psalm 45.1-2, 45.6-9; James 1.17-27; Mark 7.1-8, 7.14-23

James tells us to 'be doers of the word. and not merely hearers who deceive themselves. For if any are hearers of the word and not doers, they are like those who look at themselves in a mirror; for they look at themselves and, on going away, immediately forget what they were like'. James wants us to let what we have heard impel us into action. No sitting in the pews not letting the Spirit into our lives to disturb us. He wants us to 'welcome with meekness the implanted word that has the power to save [our] souls and then get out and do something for God.


