✝ PP's 5th September

It was 1728. This Anglican priest, son of a priest, graduate of Oxford University and recently returned to London from an unsuccessful incumbency in America, drops in to Saint Paul's Cathedral for Evening Prayer. The choristers sing Psalm 130 and John Wesley is "profoundly moved". Wesley begins his journey toward the Light, assisted by Moravian missionaries and Saint Paul's correspondence to the First-century church. Australia remained undiscovered.

It was 1521. This son of a coal-miner is in hiding in inhospitable Wartburg Castle in Bavaria, a price on his head for daring to point out the inconsistencies between "the faith once delivered to the saints" and current church practice. He was at times profoundly depressed and Psalm 130 encouraged him. Martin Luther also wrote a commentary on Saint Paul's Letter to the Romans. The Chinese didn't think "the Great South Land" was worth the trouble.

It was 1919. Pope Pius VI proclaimed 100 days indulgence for the dead for reciting the "De Profundis" (Psalm 130, or 129 in his reckoning) ... in Latin. There had been war and there was plague. There was Anzac Day.

This Psalm has four stanzas in its eight verses. The first is the soul at "rock bottom". The second is the turning to a "higher power". The third is the Heavenly Father dealing with our guilt and fear. Finally, the Holy Spirit fills us to overflowing and we just can't shut up.

That's real martyrdom. No explosives involved.
