

#### TWENTIETH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

– Sunday 10 October 2021

Job 23.1-9, 16-17; Psalm 22.1-15; Hebrews 4.12-16; Mark 10.17-31

Psalm 22 speaks very honestly of the hard times that come with being human, times when God might seem far away. 'My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?' says the Psalmist. These are the words Jesus cried out on the cross, in the depth of his suffering. And yet Jesus himself reminds us that God does not forsake us, that there is hope and wholeness for the world. Right there on the cross, Jesus embodies the presence of God with us, holding the broken and hurting world in his outstretched, crucified arms.

Reflect on your life right now. What hurts? What is hard? Place all your hurt and suffering in Jesus' gentle and compassionate arms. Pray that he will fill you with hope and wholeness.

Wouldn't it be great if these were as simple and clear cut as they sound?

Sadly however, when you see, define, understand, or measure these they are often a little more complex than expected. We can use basic law or rules like the commandments, but even then, the reality can be difficult.

In this week's Gospel Jesus says:

#### "No one is Good but God alone" (Mark 10:18),

an interesting observation that possibly requires a little reflection.

When we consider that even the best of us is far from perfect, and in fact, the more perfect we see ourselves, is what perhaps reflects our imperfection. Whilst I realise that this is probably a little confusing, when you take it in, we are able to better understand the idea that the *"first shall be last and the last shall be first.*
