




ST LUKE, EVANGELIST AND MARTYR

Jeremiah 8.22 – 9.3; Psalm 145.10-18; 2 Timothy 4.9-17a; Luke 10.1-9

Reaching out to others in mission can be an uncomfortable experience. If a number of people make a commitment to serve our Lord in mission, the task is made easier. It is also made easier in the knowledge that the Holy Spirit is with us all the way and that we should understand that the Lord would not send us out except in the knowledge that he believes that we can achieve good results if we focus on his mission. The Lord says that those we meet will be touched by the sense of the presence of the Holy Spirit in us. How encouraging is that?

Jesus said to them, "The harvest is plentiful, but the labourers are few. Therefore pray earnestly to the Lord of the harvest to send out labourers into his harvest".

Jesus tells the new evangelists to go on ahead, heal, preach, and pray that the Lord would send more workers. The fields are ripe with a bumper crop. The time to harvest is now. So there is a time limit. The issue of work. This is referring to the hard work of a farmer who sweats and labours for the harvest. He plows, sows, cultivates, harvests. Only after these hard tasks can he enjoy the harvest.

In Gospel labour, there is another type of hard work involved...pray earnestly. Work hard at praying...do we work hard in prayer? What is the disciple to pray..... "Therefore pray earnestly to the Lord of the harvest to send out labourers into his harvest". Jesus doesn't say, pray for the harvest. He says, "pray to the Lord of the harvest for additional workers". Pray for the labourers who are already doing the work. Jesus disciples are to pray to Jesus, and tell Him that He needs more workers. Why would the Lord of the Harvest command me a lowly day labourer to ask Him for more workers? Because he would pray these prayers if he were here on earth. Please make this part of your everyday prayer for God to send out labourers into the harvest.
