ST SIMON AND ST JUDE, APOSTLES & MARTYRS

Deuteronomy 32.1-4; Psalm 19.1-6; Jude 1-3, 17-25; Luke 6.12-16

Simon and Jude were chosen by Jesus to be apostles, or messengers, to go out and spread the Gospel and the love of Christ Jesus.

All of our readings today tie together this idea of being messengers: from Deuteronomy, "let the earth hear the words of my mouthfor I will proclaim the name of the Lord"; from Psalm 19, "sound has gone out through all the world: and their words to the ends of the earth"; the Epistle provides advice for the mission, while Luke's Gospel gives us the names of Jesus' chosen Apostles.

The Melanesian Brotherhood, MBH, founded in 1925, headquartered in the Solomon Islands and extending over those islands, Vanuatu, Papua New Guinea and the Torres Strait, took the example of Simon and Jude as their patron saints. Melanesian Brothers go out in pairs or small groups to take the Gospel to the people. They live simple lives of poverty, chastity and obedience, and follow Christ's example of prayer, mission and service, working and living with locals.
