NAIDOC - a brief background.

Our Indigenous Sisters and Brothers have been concerned for their own well-being since the time of the coming of the British under Governor Arthur Phillip. Phillip originally had a benevolent attitude to the original inhabitants of the area around Sydney but, during his latter years, this relationship soured significantly with ongoing calamitous results.

By 1937, there was a number of Aboriginal justice groups and the Australian Aborigines' Progressive Association (AAPA) of NSW (an "umbrella group") called on Aboriginal People to observe a Day of Mourning concurrently with the White Man's Day of Rejoicing, celebrating 150 years of "white men in Australia" in 1938. Their hope was to highlight the deplorable conditions that many Aboriginal People were living under. This was taken up by many church bodies as well as the government via Prime Minister Joseph Lyons.

By 1957, the date had been changed from January to July and the committee had formed as the National Aboriginal Day Observance Committee (NADOC). In 1991, this name was changed to NAIDOC (National Aboriginal and Islanders Day Observance Committee) to recognise Torres Strait Islanders and the cultures of all Indigenous Inhabitants for the whole week. Hence we celebrate with our Indigenous Sisters and Brothers today!

Today we read the well-known story of the Good Samaritan. It's hard for us to imagine how this would have sounded to Jesus' original audience as Samaritans were regarded as schismatics or perhaps even as heretics, but the thought that one of them might be good was a virtual impossibility. Nonetheless, Jesus commands his hearers, and us, to 'go and do likewise'. It means we must help those even whom we revile. It's not easy, but it is, at its heart, a simple command.

- Jesus Christ, you show me that even those I despise can teach me something, and that they are worthy of your love through me. Help me never to forget this teaching, and to love each person I meet so that I may honour you.
