We invite all Parishioners to join us for the Annual Meeting @ 2pm Sunday the 13th of March 2022 in the Latham Centre.


Are You on the Parish Electoral Roll?

We have been given a lot to think about over the last few weeks as we read Luke's Gospel and this week's is no different. Jesus depicts his community as vulnerable and as 'blessed' in that vulnerability. A vulnerable community can become for the afflicted an instrument of the hospitality of God. As if the Beatitudes were not radical enough, Luke now pushes the vulnerability to fresh extremes.

The central theme beginning at verse 27 begins with 'Love your enemies', and what it means in practice. Return blessings for a curse, turning the other cheek, etc, all involve responding to injury or demand with generosity. In themselves such actions make no sense. Jesus in not laying down maxims to be followed literally. As in the case of the Beatitudes, they only make sense in the context of the vision of God and relationship to God that Jesus communicates to his own. So, he concludes with 'you will be children of the Most High, who is kind to the ungrateful and the wicked' (v.35). Blessings

Seventh Sunday after Epiphany

In this week's gospel reading Jesus gives us practical advice about how to live a good life: we are to love those that we would not normally be drawn towards – our enemies. We are to do good to those who hate us, bless those who curse us, and pray for those who abuse us. This doesn't mean that those who do bad things to us should be immune from the consequences of their acts, but rather that we should not act in a way that damages ourselves even further. We are not to be judgemental, and we are to avoid condemning others. We are to try to fill our lives with goodness.

- Forgive me, Lord, for when- and wherever I have had abuse and hatred in my heart. Help me to amend my life so that I come closer to others and to you.
- Give thanks for the work and witness of the Church of the Province of Myanmar, especially at this time of tension.
