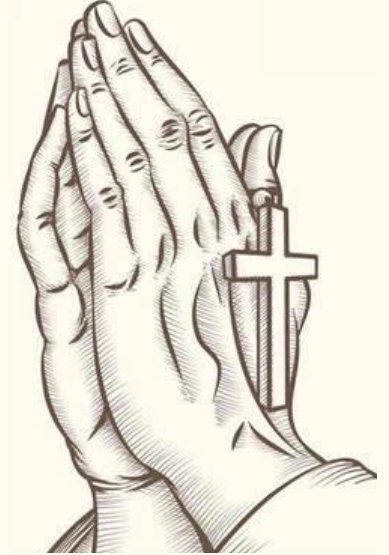

Palm Sunday

In today's reading from St Luke we read how Jesus was received as he made his entry into Jerusalem. It was a parody of an adventus, the ceremonial arrival of a Roman governor into his province. This would have been with a warhorse decked out in its State finery and, one imagines, not -so enthusiastic onlookers at the sides of the road, looking and the imperial might of the occupying force. Jesus upends this, arriving on a lowly donkey as the crowds shouted praises to God 'for all the deeds of power that they had seen' done by Jesus.
