

# PP's 13th November

Today we set aside time to remember those who gave of themselves in the carnage of war, particularly what came to be known as the Great War and latterly as World War One.

Unfortunately over the last twenty years or so, the actual theme of remembrance of lives lost and broken, along with minds shattered, has tended to be somewhat lost, to be replaced by a more militaristic occasion, almost a celebration of warfare and battles and our military in general.

As a nation, we spend more per head of population than any other nation in memorialising that first horrendous conflict and those that have occurred since. If one examines the history of the many conflicts in which our people have been involved over the many years of our nationhood and beyond, one discovers that as well as the very many examples of self-sacrifice and camaraderie, there has also been horrendous waste, loss of life both for military and civilian personnel and hatreds disseminated which continue to this day.

As a student of warfare and the military, it is obvious to me that some warfare is unfortunately inevitable as a very final resort. However, as those who believe in the message of Jesus of Nazareth, the Son of God, we need to make every effort to show forth God's Peace in our lives as Jesus bore witness. We also need to keep our politicians and our military and our nation following the true path of peace and diplomacy so that warfare is seen as the very last resort in self protection rather than adding to various conflicts at the bec-and-call of militaristic friends, and armaments manufacturers whose basic motive is profit.

May God give us and all his people knowledge of His way of Peace and the strength of character to follow Him thus.
