

# PP's 16th October

How do you pray to God our Father?

Do we wear down God.



We need to live with the requirements of the covenant given to us. The first parable addresses the temptation to give up hope and to loose heart in the midst of our own troubles and that of the world. It appears to commend praying to God with the kind of persistence displayed by the widow in her dealings with the judge. The parable hardly means to suggest God need to be worn down like the judge. Basically it commends an attitude or trust in God that would motivate such persistence. He gives in, as we read, "And will not God grant justice, so that she may not wear me down by constantly coming". And the parable continues the theme of prayer but addressed to those who "trusted in their own righteousness and regarded others with contempt".

The Pharisee prays, yes, but focus should be upon God, this man prayed about and for himself, and unfortunately upon the failing of others.

This parable illustrates Luke's theme of reversal (v14). It offers comfort to find themselves caught in situations judges sinful – whether in the areas of sexuality or marital involvement, or occupation. Prayer allows God to communicate with us the divine vision of life and reality. Two people come to pray, only one found the hospitality that was there.
