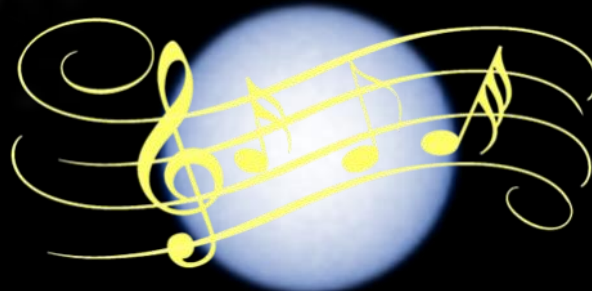

PP's 19th June

Since the Apostolic Church, Christians have been celebrating the Eucharist, instituted by Christ himself during the Passover meal with his disciples. This meal is which we receive the body and blood of Christ was instituted on Maundy Thursday. Ignatius of Antioch referred to the Eucharist as the 'medicine of immortality'.

Thomas Aquinas considered the Eucharist to be the greatest of all sacraments. In some ways every Sunday is a feast of the Eucharist, because by participating in the Mass, or Holy Communion or Eucharist, and in receiving Communion, we are honouring and celebrating the Eucharist.

The feast of Corpus Christi in the Australian Anglican Church lectionary is usually called 'The Thanksgiving of the Holy communion'. But the festival owes a large debt to St. Juliana, a nun of Liege, Belgium, who was led to start a celebration of the Mass around AD 1230. However, by the 14th century, the feast became universally celebrated.

St. Thomas Aquinas is given credit for many of the customs and hymns associated with Corpus Christi. The feast of Corpus Christi is celebrated in some Anglican Churches, especially Anglo-Catholic Churches.

Corpus Christi

At the end of the passage we read from St Mark's gospel today, we are told about Christ's Institution of the Holy Eucharist. Day by day, week by week, year in, year out, the Church offers Christ's Body and Blood to us as food to nourish us on our Christian journey, food in which the Real Presence of Jesus Christ is to be found. 'Do this in memory of me.' In his famous passage on the Eucharist Dom Gregory Dix asks, 'Was ever another command so obeyed? For century after century, spreading slowly to every continent and country and among every race on earth, this action has been done, in every conceivable human circumstance, for every conceivable human need from infancy and before it to extreme old age and after it, from the pinnacle of earthly greatness to the refuge of fugitives in the caves and dens of the earth...' If I were to examine myself, would I find times in my life where I had taken the great gift of the Eucharist for granted, or ignored it? more than another? Why or why not?
