This is the Third attempt at assembling my thoughts. Considering the defamation case currently wrangling its way through the Federal Court the brutal disregard for the sanctity of human life evidenced by current events in Ukraine, the fanatical persecution of Bernard Colleary and Julian Assange and, furthermore, the commemoration of Anzac Day, my words dance lightly and circumspectly.

It may be a "just war", but truth is always the first casualty. "Warcraft", as entertainment, is admittedly less "on the nose" than the criminality of a corrupt, genocidal kleptocracy. The inevitable truth of the will of Almighty God is laid down for our reality check in Psalm 46:

Verses 1 to 3: tell us, "Unless the Lord builds the house, they labour in vain who build it" (Psalm 127:1)

"Take the log out of your own eye, and then you will see clearly to take the speck out of your brother's eye." (Matthew 7:5), A nation's weakness is its injustice and inequity no matter how well-armed.

Verses 4 to 6: The Eternal Father supplies our every need, regardless of opinion to the contrary.

Verses 7 to 11: God will put an end to war, and it won't be pretty (Revelation 11:18)

Note: "It is a fearful matter to fall into the hands of the Living God" (Hebrews 10:7)
