TPP's 20th March

Have you ever thought, when something bad happens to someone, have you wondered what that person had done wrong? That is part of the thought of the people in today's Gospel Lesson as they look at the cruelty of Pilate, the eighteen who died when the tower of Siloam fell on them. Jesus says, 'no'. So, were those who died worse than the rest in Jerusalem? 'No'. 'Unless you repent, you will perish just as they did', Jesus said.

Then Jesus, told another parable for our learning. Here, the vineyard worker asks for another year for the tree to bear fruit. God is the owner, the gardener nourishes the tree, and Jesus, nurtures his flock, you and me, with love. So, this Gospel reading is telling us we should turn to Jesus and repent, sooner rather than later, if we would like to achieve all that God has planned for us as disciples and the Church.
