Christ the King is a title of Jesus in Christianity referring to the idea of the Kingdom of God where the Christ is described as seated at the right hand of God.

Many Christian denominations consider the kingly office of Christ to be one of the threefold offices: Christ is a prophet, priest, and king. In the Gospel of Luke, the angel Gabriel proclaims to Mary:

*"Behold, you will conceive in your womb and bear a son,
and you shall name him Jesus."*

Outside of the gospels, the First Epistle of Timothy (6:14–15) explicitly applies the phrase of "King of kings and lord of lords" to Jesus Christ. In the Book of Revelation it is declared that the Lamb is "King of kings, and Lord of lords". The Feast of Christ the King was instituted by Pope Pius XI in 1925. The General Roman Calendar of 1969 moved its observance in the Roman Rite to the last Sunday of Ordinary Time, the final Sunday of the liturgical year. Most Anglicans, Lutherans and some Protestants celebrate it on the same day.

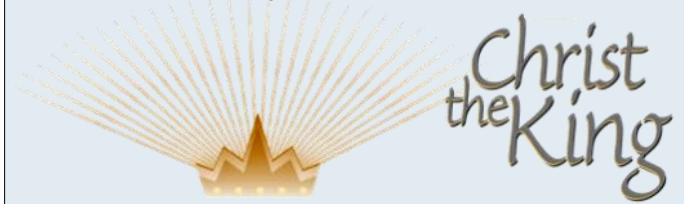
