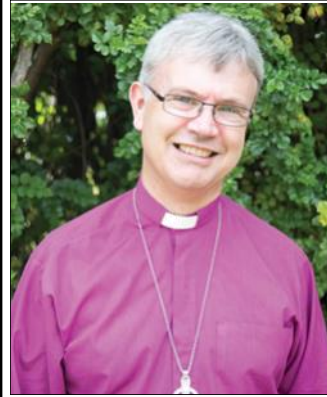
## Blue Cross Community Care

## PP's 21st August

What do we do on the Sabbath? Attend Church, play some sport, or go for a run, or if a medical person, do you go out and heal someone?

In Jesus' day things were very different! Six days were allotted to work, but the Sabbath was a day of rest. We are probably saying today is my Sabbath, but there are many who must work in our society to keep things moving. Just think of the workers in the energy generation supply companies that keep our lights and electronics working, and many others. But in Jesus time you could lead your animals out to get water, but not help a sick person unless their illness threatened their life.

So, Jesus was in trouble because he healed the woman. That was work! 'Is not this what the sabbath is all about' Jesus said. The rejoicing of the crowd, in contrast to the discomfiture of the leaders, illustrates once more the divided response to Jesus' ministry.
