Like little children

The Christian Church, in all its various expressions, has always emphasised training and instructing the young. This is inherited from our Jewish antecedents who were instructed by God to “teach your children well”. Hence it transpires that the Anglican Church has invested heavily in education. But with different results to the various orders of Roman Catholics. It is quite rare for an ordinand to come from an Anglican “private” school background. To suggest that the reason for this is that it takes financial success to consider a non-government school and there's no money in the clergy, is as preposterous as asserting that “church schools inoculate against religion”.

It is nearly five years since “*The Royal Commission into Institutional Responses to Child Sexual Abuse* “ returned its findings. As it transpired, its findings were mild compared with similar processes overseas, particularly in Ireland, Poland and Germany. In Canada, whole Anglican dioceses were insolvent from the damages. In Australia, these days, hardly a month goes by that some book isn't published or a church building sold up as a result. Failures and sins of the past are lead weights on the feet that are supposed to bring the Good Tidings. We end up paying more attention to the Office of the Children's Guardian than guarding the souls of tomorrow's Christian leaders, and so, we agonise over the shortage of clergy.

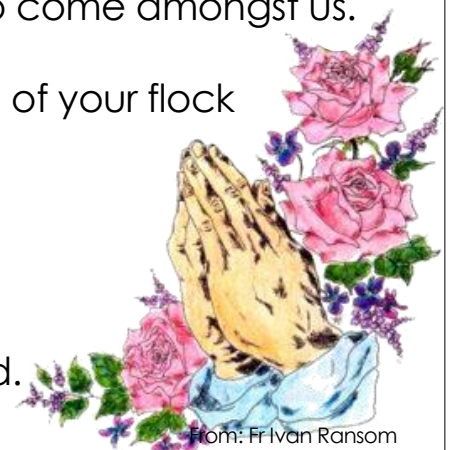
