"Who is like God ?" ("mi-ca-el" in Hebrew) was a not an uncommon given name among Hebrews in 5,000 B.C.. Most of the "Micks" in the Bible are just run-of-the-mill regular mortal guys It is not until we come to the New Testament and the Epistle of Jude and the Book of the Apocalypse, that we read that an Archangel has a name: "Michael" .The Bible is peppered with anonymous angels. The angel who broke the news 'to the Virgin Mary is the only other angel identified. He's "Gabriel".

Every major religion has angels of some sort or other. The Norse gods, the pagans of ancient Rome, the Zend Avesta, The Koran, Japanese Anime and even the Arunta of Uluru all feature extra-terrestrial beings with wings. Our Jewish brethren have a jam-packed anthology of angel stories.

In the Book of Books Angels appear unnervingly ordinary: posted to see Adam and Eve stay expelled from the Garden of Eden, breaking the news to an elderly couple over tea and scones that the missus is a pregnant pensioner, sent to arrange a marriage, direct a general, scare a donkey, wrestle, wake a kid in the middle of the night, conduct guided tours around the New Jerusalem, etc..

If anything, it shows that it pays to be nice to strangers. You never know who has dropped in for Morning Tea.

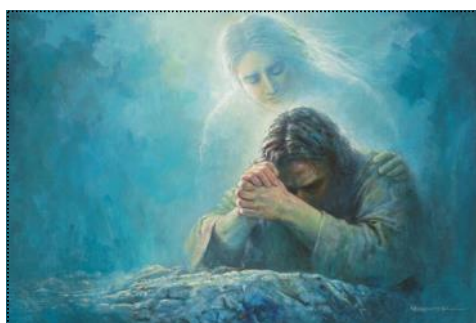
