

Follow me?

Our Lord Jesus definitely took some strange people to be his disciples. Look at James and John - "sons of thunder" - rowdy types who let their human emotions get the better of them. Yet Jesus not only chose these rowdy blokes but brought them into his inner circle. As we note elsewhere, Jesus even took them, along with Peter, to be with the grieving family when they had heard that the little girl in the family had died.

Yet, James and John were the sort that let their emotions get the better of them at times, particularly emotions of violence and revenge.

This pair, these two brothers, were the same blokes whose immediate reaction when Jesus along with them and their colleagues were insulted by a village of despised Samaritans, was to suggest the village be obliterated with fire from heaven. They were of course chastised by Jesus, because they had failed to understand the way he worked. AND they learnt! And in learning and growing in understanding, they grew closer to Jesus and became more faithful followers.

The lesson? No matter who we are or what we might have been, Jesus wants us to follow Him.
