It is tempting to consider this portion of the Holy Gospel from the perspective of mere moralism - rules to follow for a successful career or how to win friends and influence people. But such an approach is blind to the True Light.

A routine dinner party becomes the moment of Divine Revelation as the Master asserts Redemption's authority over tattered, incompetent and pretentious social norms.

The message is repeated with emphasis by the Apostle Paul:

"Let this mind be in you, which was also in Christ Jesus: who, being in the form of God, thought it not robbery to be equal with God: but made himself of no reputation, and took upon him the form of a servant, and was made in the likeness of men: and being found in fashion as a man, he humbled himself, and became obedient unto death, even the death of the cross." (Philippians 2)

Gracious God,



#### TWELFTH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

Jesus again heals on the Sabbath, at the beginning of a dinner party (vv. 2-6) and then gives a counter-cultural lesson.

He tells his audience not to throw a dinner party for friends, but rather to invite the poor, the crippled, the lame, and the blind because they will not be able to repay the host with a reciprocal invitation, unlike their friends. Where in our lives and in our parishes do we welcome in those who could never repay us?

- Jesus Christ, friend of the outcast, help me to give without expecting anything in return. Help me to see your face in those whom society rejects.
- Give thanks for all those who donate so generously to ABM and AID. May God bless them for their open-handed and open-hearted generosity
