Throughout our parish, Newcastle Diocese and the Australian Anglican Church, there's a (generally) quiet but often bold and, at times, fearsome band of women who are one of the strengths of the Church.

Today the Church recalls their efforts over the generations and notes that their many activities have enabled very many parishes to grow and survive and thrive. The many and varied women's groups all come under the banner of the Anglican Women of Australia.

As AWA Diocesan President, Lorraine Phillips writes "The aim of Anglican Women is to work towards the extension of Christ's kingdom through: worship, study, service, fellowship and giving to promote cooperation and understanding between the various groups which may exist in a parish."

The Anglican Women's Diocesan Executive meets 4 times per calendar year and organises two functions per year which are open to all women.

- \* A Lenten Retreat and/or a Quiet Day during the season of Lent
- \* And an Annual Conference Spring Celebration, which is held on the first Tuesday in September each year, this year it will be the 6th September 2022 at St Peter's Anglican Church, East Maitland.

Newcastle's Anglican Women provides 'Thank You Boxes' which can be used, not only to thank God for the many blessings in our lives, but also for donations to support a nominated worthy charity. The 2022/23 year will be in support of the 'ABM Literacy and Numeracy Program for PNG'.
