This incident is reported in all Four Gospels. Matthew and Mark use identical words, describing it as taking place at Bethany (Hebrew for "my place") in the house of "Simon the Leper".

Papias of Hierapolis (60-130AD), testified that Matthew's Gospel was originally in Aramaic. He also asserted that, in contrast to the other (synoptic) gospels, John recorded in chronological order. So where Luke identifies the householder as a "Pharisee" (which was all that Theophilus needed to know), John, in today's Gospel identifies the familiar threesome: Mary, Martha and their brother, Lazarus as the householder. ("the Leper" is likely a former owner of that address).

Lazarus, recently raised from death, is identified by Luke as a good Pharisee whose business name is "Simon". His version is otherwise rich with detail, but John's version, which we read as today's Gospel, details the characters, likely long deceased by the time of writing. He adds an acerbic assessment of Judas Escariot and leaves us wondering if the woman with the ointment was Mary Magdalene !
