

Today as we remember the Martyrs of New Guinea, we praise God that so many were willing to spend their lives giving Christian care to the people of Papua New Guinea. That year, 1941, the Anglican Church in Papua New Guinea celebrated it Jubilee.

At that time, the war with Japan had little impact, and co-operation between the Christian mission, including German Lutherans, continued. The Japanese entered Rabaul, New Britain in January 1942, with Europeans evacuated to Australia. By July the Japanese made their landing at Gona, New Guinea and by August had captured Kokoda. Anglican staff at Gona and Sangara were in the path of the invaders and were killed around August 1942. The martyrs of New Guinea were: 11 Anglican, 15 Lutheran, 24 Methodist, 188 Roman Catholic and many other Christians during the Second World War.

May God our Father hear our prayer as we pray that peace should surround our world and beat the sword into ploughshares.

MARTYRS OF NEW GUINEA

Jesus tells us that unless a grain of wheat falls into the earth and dies, it remains just a single grain; but if it dies, it bears much fruit. The Martyrs of New Guinea, which was then part of the Anglican Church, gave up their lives to honour their Saviour. Most of us are not called to martyrdom, but we can offer things to God that are costly nonetheless. What can we give over to God as individuals and as parishes that will bear much fruit?

- Jesus Christ, Inspiration of the martyrs, help me to offer my whole life to you, no matter what the cost, so that I will be fruitful.
- Give thanks for the work and witness of the Anglican Church of Papua New Guinea, remembering especially today the staff and ordinands at Newton Theological College in Popondetta, and the staff and students at Adult Literacy Centres around the country.
