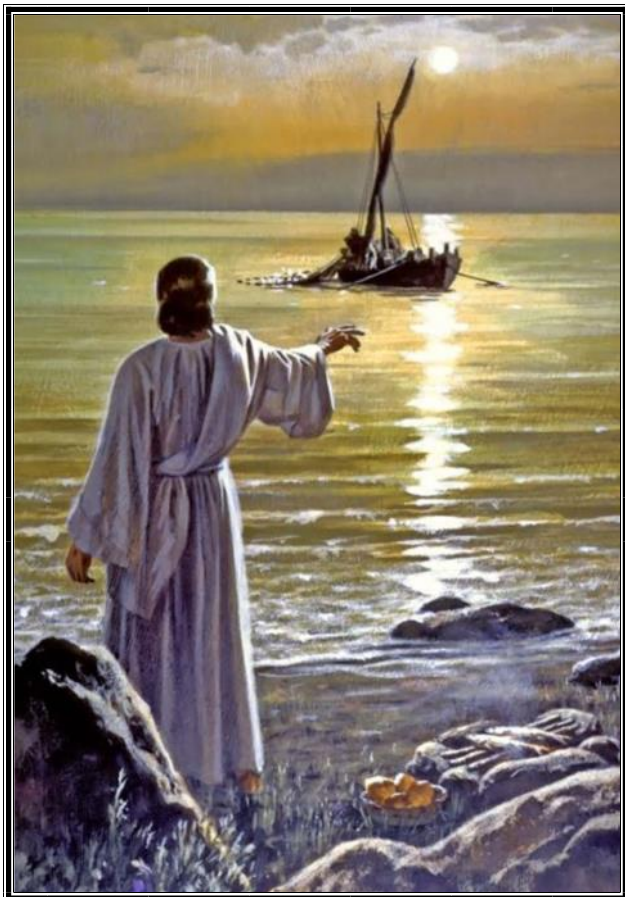

“Don't get hysterical ! You'll be netting people from now on.”

How easy it is to get caught up in the drama of the moment and be oblivious of the End Game. It wasn't the spectacular haul of fish that was of eternal significance. It was the call to “leave all and follow Jesus”: leave the boat and the nets and go around the countryside prodding people about their need of a saviour. It was natural enough for the professional fisherman, Simon Peter, to see this as a massive disruption of his lifestyle.

It was probably for the best that he didn't realise that it would end up with him being crucified upside down in the Emperor's garden, after witnessing the death and resurrection of our Lord and spreading the message across several empires.

Enduring radical change and facing the “impossible” task is the call The Master makes to anyone who would 'be his disciple'. The point is that when Jesus calls the shots, all things are possible. Anxiety about the future is irrelevant:

“I know whom I have believed, and I am convinced that he is able to guard until that Day what has been entrusted to me.” (2Timothy 1:12)

Fifth Sunday after Epiphany

Isaiah 6.1-8; Psalm 138; 1 Corinthians 15.1-11; Luke 5.1-11

Today we read of Jesus calling some of the first disciples: Simon Peter, James and John. They were ordinary people, partners in a fishing enterprise. One can imagine that Peter must have groaned at the itinerant preacher with his instruction to cast out his net one more time. Peter had been up all night doing precisely that but with no result. However, when he pulls in his net this time his catch is so big that he needs not only the staff on his boat to help, but also James and John lend a hand. Jesus promises Peter that he will transform his skill at fishing into one that will benefit God's mission: he will become a 'fisher of people'.
