PP's 8th May

I've noticed over the past several weeks that our Bishop, Dr Peter Stuart, has written a number of times both to the clergy and the media, about the need for Christian people and Anglicans in particular, to consider well those for whom they vote in the forthcoming Federal Election.

There are some who suggest that "politics and religion should not be mixed" but in truth Our Lord Jesus was very much involved in the politics of His day. Ultimately it was His political involvement that in large part led to His trial and crucifixion. He dared to speak out against the political authorities and "parties" of the time - Pilate, the puppet ruler for the Romans, the High Priest and the various "parties", including the Pharisees and the Sadducees and others who were often enemies, but conspired together to have Jesus removed from the public sphere and killed.

Jesus dared to be critical of the way the politics and religion of the time dealt with people, particularly the poor, the beggars, the criminals including tax-collectors and the most marginalised in society. Much of his teaching was to encourage His followers - His Apostles and Disciples - to have a real concern for all these marginalised people. The Gospels are full of this encouragement for such people, prime examples being the Sermon on the Mount in Matthew's Gospel, the Sermon on the Plain in Luke's Gospel, His Parable of the Good Samaritan showing a Samaritan helping a hated Jew. to name just a few.

The gist of all this is that for EACH ONE OF US as His present-day disciples, we should base all our decisions and actions on "WHAT DID JESUS DO AND TEACH", rather than what is good for me and my hip pocket? Examples include our concern for those living in poverty, with hunger, no home, unable to access proper medical care, the earth we hand on to future generations..... and the list continues.

Following the example of Our Lord, let us consider carefully and prayerfully all this on voting day.
