Ingratitude worse than Leprosy!

The World Health Organisation reckons there are only 200,000 people worldwide currently suffering from Hansen's Disease, or Leprosy. In Australia there might be a dozen sufferers, currently. Antibiotics used during the treatment will kill the bacteria that cause leprosy. But while the treatment can cure the disease and prevent it from getting worse, it does not reverse nerve damage or physical disfiguration that may have occurred before the diagnosis. Early treatment avoids disability. These days, Leprosy is rare.

Before modern times, the only way to treat Leprosy was to contain the disease by isolating the sufferer. Although the Law of Moses prescribed a ritual to celebrate healing, everybody knew it was a burden for life and a death sentence.

The ten tragic cases had found a common cause in their suffering and being shunned. No barriers between Jew and Samaritan here! Not until it came to the "ridiculous" direction from Jesus to "show yourselves to the priests". Maybe the Samaritan was embarrassed to ask the priests in the Jerusalem Temple for the healing ceremony and have to endure the remark: "I never done one of them before, especially to a Samaritan". But his immediate response is to go back to our Great High Priest and say "Thank you!".

Gratitude is mainspring of Worship: "Giving thanks in all things" as the Apostle Paul would say, and note: it was his faith that cured him, not the ceremony in the Temple.

"By grace you are saved through faith, not from yourselves. It is the gift of God. Not by self-effort, in case anyone wants to brag".




PENTECOST 18
