



BOOKED OUT!

It is the fear of many devout people that they might miss out at the resurrection.

They arrive to find the number of the Elect has been filled and the "House Full" sign is hanging on the Pearly Gates.

Well, in today's reading from John's Gospel, chapter fourteen, our Saviour makes it clear that this is NOT how God works. "Believe in God: Believe in me too". You, personally, have security and assurance because of a particular relationship with the Lord of Life: you are nourished spiritually by His body broken for you and His blood, poured out as a libation on the dust of Calvary Jesus was the sacrificial Lamb of God whose offering of himself as the living Word of God, was enough to pay for the sins of the whole universeincluding yours and mine.

It was American author, Hal Lindsay, who in 1970 published the best-selling paperback: "Late Great Planet Earth". In it, he reviews the lamentable state of Western civilisation and culture and this was before online gambling and Tik-tok. He thoroughly dissected the ills of the world and in a thin, best-seller proposed the answer: Christians take over Government before the Lord returns.

It is still with us today. Self-righteousness reigns supreme. e.g: What happened January 6th 2021 in Washington D.C. USA? They were running according to Hal Lindsay's playbook, unsurprisingly, with the end of the world looming, environment was the least of their concerns, which is why Bolsonaro, a fan of Hal Lindsay's, was content to encourage the pillage of the Amazon Rain Forest.

Now, the forgoing may appear irrelevant to the topic, but in 1997 the full-length movie "The Rapture" was listed and in 2017 the movie, "Left Behind", posing as a science fiction epic, was released with a video game. This latter movie is not about Aussie Rules football, it's about the misapplication of select parts of Holy Scripture to promote the view that in the 'End Time' people will 'disappear' at random, causing immense social upheaval. Airline pilots, truck drivers and on-duty emergency personnel being of particular interest. That movie gained quite a following, particularly in North America. But I reckon I've seen more sound theology on "Doctor Who".

The two passages of Holy Scripture, which have been mulled over for two millenniums, are the words of Our Lord (Matthew 24:37-40) and an observation by the Apostle Paul (1 Thessalonians 4:15-17). The question is: "Are they talking about the same thing?" To my mind, Jesus is warning disciples about the uncertainty of mortal existence, while Paul is reflecting on the Christian hope of Eternal Life.

Coming back to the Gospel reading for this Fifth Sunday in Easter, the good news is that our eternal place with our Lord is the result of his graciousness and generosity rather than any merit or deserving on our part. Our Heavenly Father, as in all things, is sovereign and in charge. The decree has been published: "we are set free from the slavery to guilt and fear, we live by the grace of God having been gifted Eternal Life and, so, there is a place prepared for us in the resurrection of the body and the life everlasting".

Oh, the bliss of this glorious thought, my sin, not in part, but the whole, is nailed to His cross and I bear it no more. Praise the Lord, it is well with my soul.

A reading from the First letter to Peter

11 Beloved, I urge you as aliens and exiles to abstain from the desires of the flesh that wage war against the soul. 12 Conduct yourselves honourably among the Gentiles, so that, though they malign you as evildoers, they may see your honourable deeds and glorify God when he comes to judge. 13 For the Lord's sake accept the authority of every human institution, whether of the emperor as supreme, 14 or of governors, as sent by him to punish those who do wrong and to praise those who do right. 15 For it is God's will that by doing right you should silence the ignorance of the foolish. 16 As servants of God, live as free people, yet do not use your freedom as a pretext for evil. 17 Honour everyone. Love the family of believers. Fear God. Honour the emperor. 18 Slaves, accept the authority of your masters with all deference, not only those who are kind and gentle but also those who are harsh. 19 For it is to your credit if, being aware of God, you endure pain while suffering unjustly. 20 If you endure when you are beaten for doing wrong, where is the credit in that? But if you endure when you do right and suffer for it, you have God's approval. 21 For to this you have been called, because Christ also suffered for you, leaving you an example, so that you should follow in his steps. 22 'He committed no sin, and no deceit was found in his mouth.' 23 When he was abused, he did not return abuse; when he suffered, he did not threaten; but he entrusted himself to the one who judges justly. 24 He himself bore our sins in his body on the cross, so that, free from sins, we might live for righteousness; by his wounds you have been healed. 25 For you were going astray like sheep, but now you have returned to the shepherd and guardian of your souls.

The Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to John Chapter 14 commencing at verse 1.

Glory to you Lord Jesus Christ

1 'Do not let your hearts be troubled. Believe in God, believe also in me. 2 In my Father's house there are many dwelling-places. If it were not so, would I have told you that I go to prepare a place for you? 3 And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come again and will take you to myself, so that where I am, there you may be also. 4 And you know the way to the place where I am going.' 5 Thomas said to him, 'Lord, we do not know where you are going. How can we know the way?' 6 Jesus said to him, 'I am the way, and the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me. 7 If you know me, you will know my Father also. From now on you do know him and have seen him.' 8 Philip said to him, 'Lord, show us the Father, and we will be satisfied.' 9 Jesus said to him, 'Have I been with you all this time, Philip, and you still do not know me? Whoever has seen me has seen the Father. How can you say, "Show us the Father"? 10 Do you not believe that I am in the Father and the Father is in me? The words that I say to you I do not speak on my own; but the Father who dwells in me does his works. 11 Believe me that I am in the Father and the Father is in me; but if you do not, then believe me because of the works themselves. 12 Very truly, I tell you, the one who believes in me will also do the works that I do and, in fact, will do greater works than these, because I am going to the Father. 13 I will do whatever you ask in my name, so that the Father may be glorified in the Son. 14 If in my name you ask me for anything, I will do it.
