

...So, you thought that there were just two creeds?

Nicene Creed for Holy Communion and the Apostles' Creed for everything else...But you forgot about the Creed of Saint Athanasius!

...Athanasius was a bright young deacon in the church at Alexandria in the 300's. Also serving under the Pope of Alexandria at that time was a wily old priest, Arius ,who taught that Jesus was a good man, maybe a magician or a superb motivational speaker or maybe even an angel, but nothing more. There are lots of people who think like this, even today.

...Arius composed popular songs to promote his opinion, called "Thalia". Athanasius figured that even if Jesus were just an angel, he could only have died for his own sins, not for the sins of the whole world. Athanasius composed his own "Thallium" which we still use today: "Glory to God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit; as in the beginning, so now and for all eternity". (or however you say it in the original Coptic Amharic).

...Things got pretty heated, what with Arius exploiting social media (pop songs) to the maximum and Athanasius having only one tune. The Emperor, Constantine, fazed by the aggressive lyrics and having just become a Christian and learnt about the love of God, decided to impose peace. He called a General Council of Christians at Nicea in Greece. The year was 325 A.D.

...After serious consideration, the Council of Nicea published, what we now call "The Nicene Creed" Pope of Rome, Silvester, had the Latin word "filioque" added to the Creed. The Popes of Constantinople, Antioch and Alexandria, said it wasn't in the minutes and they stick to the original to this day.

Athanasius went on to become the 20th Pope of Alexandria (Coptic Orthodox Church founded by Saint Mark). Arius and Arianism was consigned to the wheelie bin of history to be dusted off in Islam, Sikhism, Mormonism, Jehovah's Witnesses etc., etc..

...The Doctrine of God became so closely defined, that it is practically impossible to speak of the Godhead, or the Holy Trinity, without committing heresy at some point. Try the Creed of Saint Athanasius.

TRINITY SUNDAY

SENTENCE:

Proclaim the Name: 'The Lord, the Lord, a God who is merciful and gracious, slow to anger and abounding in steadfast love and faithfulness.' Exacts 34.6

PRAYER OF THE DAY:

Almighty and everlasting God, you have given to us your servants grace by the confession of a true faith to acknowledge the glory of the eternal Trinity, and in the power of the divine majesty to worship the Unity: keep us steadfast in this faith, and evermore defend us from all adversities, for you live and reign, one God, for ever and ever. First Reading Exodus 34.1-8

A reading from the book of Exodus

1 The Lord said to Moses, 'Cut two tablets of stone like the former ones, and I will write on the tablets the words that were on the former tablets. which you broke. 2 Be ready in the morning, and come up in the morning to Mount Sinai and present yourself there to me, on the top of the mountain. 3 No one shall come up with you, and do not let anyone be seen throughout all the mountain; and do not let flocks or herds graze in front of that mountain.'4 So Moses cut two tablets of stone like the former ones; and he rose early in the morning and went up on Mount Sinai, as the Lord had commanded him, and took in his hand the two tablets of stone. 5 The Lord descended in the cloud and stood with him there, and proclaimed the name, 'The Lord .' 6 The Lord passed before him, and proclaimed, 'The Lord, the Lord, a God merciful and gracious, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love and faithfulness, 7 keeping steadfast love for the thousandth generation, forgiving iniquity and transgression and sin, yet by no means clearing the guilty, but visiting the iniquity of the parents upon the children and the children's children, to the third and the fourth generation.'8 And Moses quickly bowed his head towards the earth, and worshipped.
