Mission to Celebrate

Psalm 105 is a celebration of God's faithfulness and his covenantal promises to Israel. It reminds God's people of all God has done for them and this gives them the courage to live well, according to His will.

Sometimes the idea of being chosen as the covenant people is understood in a privileged way – as if being chosen somehow implies being better than others. However, we understand from this psalm that God's election of Israel as a covenant people was not to single them out as being superior to other nations. It was to set them apart for a specific missional purpose. God chose Israel to be the light to other nations, to draw others into the community of faith.

So, the psalm is not just a call to private praise and celebration. God's people are called to let their celebration spill out into the world so others can see their joy and also come to know the Lord.

This psalm reminds us that our open praise of God is a form of mission. Mission does not only include people being sent out to preach the gospel. We do not always have to tell people the whole gospel message or talk about specific bible passages to be spreading God's word. There are times when just speaking well of God, making comments about his goodness and love will sow seeds in the hearts of others.

There is also missional value in the community seeing God's people living together joyfully in praise and celebration of God. Our lifestyles and behavior send a message to the world. The challenge this psalm sets before us is to ensure that this message is an attractive and positive one where the world see us as a community celebrating and praising the goodness of our God.



FIRST READING

Genesis 29.15-28

A reading from the book of Genesis

15 Then Laban said to Jacob, 'Because you are my kinsman, should you therefore serve me for nothing? Tell me, what shall your wages be?' 16 Now Laban had two daughters; the name of the elder was Leah, and the name of the younger was Rachel. 17 Leah's eyes were lovely, and Rachel was graceful and beautiful. 18 Jacob loved Rachel; so he said, 'I will serve you seven years for your younger daughter Rachel.' 19 Laban said, 'It is better that I give her to you than that I should give her to any other man; stay with me.' 20 So Jacob served seven years for Rachel, and they seemed to him but a few days because of the love he had for her. 21 Then Jacob said to Laban, 'Give me my wife that I may go in to her, for my time is completed.' 22 So Laban gathered together all the people of the place, and made a feast. 23 But in the evening he took his daughter Leah and brought her to Jacob; and he went in to her. 24 (Laban gave his maid Zilpah to his daughter Leah to be her maid.) 25 When morning came, it was Leah! And Jacob said to Laban, 'What is this you have done to me? Did I not you for Rachel? Why then have you deceived serve with me?' 26 Laban said, 'This is not done in our country—giving the younger before the firstborn. 27 Complete the week of this one, and we will give

you the other also in return for serving me for another seven years.' 28 Jacob did so, and completed her week; then Laban gave him his daughter Rachel as a wife

 O seek his face continually.

Second Reading

Romans 8.26-39

A reading from the book of Romans

26 Likewise the Spirit helps us in our weakness; for we do not know how to pray as we ought, but that very Spirit intercedes with sighs too deep for words. 27 And God, who searches the heart, knows what is the mind of the Spirit, because the Spirit intercedes for the saints according to the will of God. 28 We know that all things work together for good for those who love God, who are called according to his purpose. 29 For those whom he foreknew he also predestined to be conformed to the image of his Son, in order that he might be the firstborn within a large family. 30 And those whom he predestined he also called; and those whom he called he also justified; and those whom he justified he also glorified. 31 What then are we to say about these things? If God is for us, who is against us? 32 He who did not withhold his own Son, but gave him up for all of us, will he not with him also give us everything else? 33 Who will bring any charge against God's elect? It is God who justifies. 34 Who is to condemn? It is Christ Jesus, who died, yes, who was raised, who is at the right hand of God, who indeed intercedes for us. 35 Who will separate us from the love of Christ? Will hardship, or distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or peril, or sword? 36 As it is written, 'For your sake we are being killed all day long; we are accounted as sheep to be slaughtered.' 37 No, in all these things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us. 38 For I am convinced that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor rulers, nor things present, nor things to come, nor powers, 39 nor height, nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord.

Matthew 13.24–30, 13.36–43

The Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according Matthew Chapter 13 commencing at verse 24.

Glory to you Lord Jesus Christ

44 'The kingdom of heaven is like treasure hidden in a field, which someone found and hid; then in his joy he goes and sells all that he has and buys that field. 45 'Again, the kingdom of heaven is like a merchant in search of fine pearls; 46 on finding one pearl of great value, he went and sold all that he had and bought it. 47 'Again, the kingdom of heaven is like a net that was thrown into the sea and caught fish of every kind; 48 when it was full, they drew it ashore, sat down, and put the good into baskets but threw out the bad. 49 So it will be at the end of the age. The angels will come out and separate the evil from the righteous 50 and throw them into the furnace of fire, where there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth. 51 'Have you understood all this?' They answered, 'Yes.' 52 And he said to them, 'Therefore every scribe who has been trained for the kingdom of heaven is like the master of a household who brings out of his treasure what is new and what is old.' 53 When Jesus had finished these parables, he left that place. 54 He came to his home town and began to teach the people in their synagogue, so that they were astounded and said, 'Where did this man get this wisdom and these deeds of power? 55 Is not this the carpenter's son? Is not his mother called Mary? And are not his brothers James and Joseph and Simon and Judas? 56 And are not all his sisters with us? Where then did this man get all this?' 57 And they took offence at him. But Jesus said to them, 'Prophets are not without honour except in their own country and in their own house.' 58 And he did not do many deeds of power there, because of their unbelief.

Romans 8 is a wonderful chapter, brim-full of hope: because the 'downpayment' of the Spirit means God is with us, making everything work for our good, making us better and growing us in faith and maturity. Paul's words are majestic and powerful as he declares that 'nothing can separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord', and that there's nothing that can question or threaten our status as God's very own children. Every time I read this passage as it sweeps along, I feel breath-taken at God's goodness, and such a welling hope and excitement that the Spirit indeed lives in me, the guarantee that God's 'got' me, come hell or high water.
