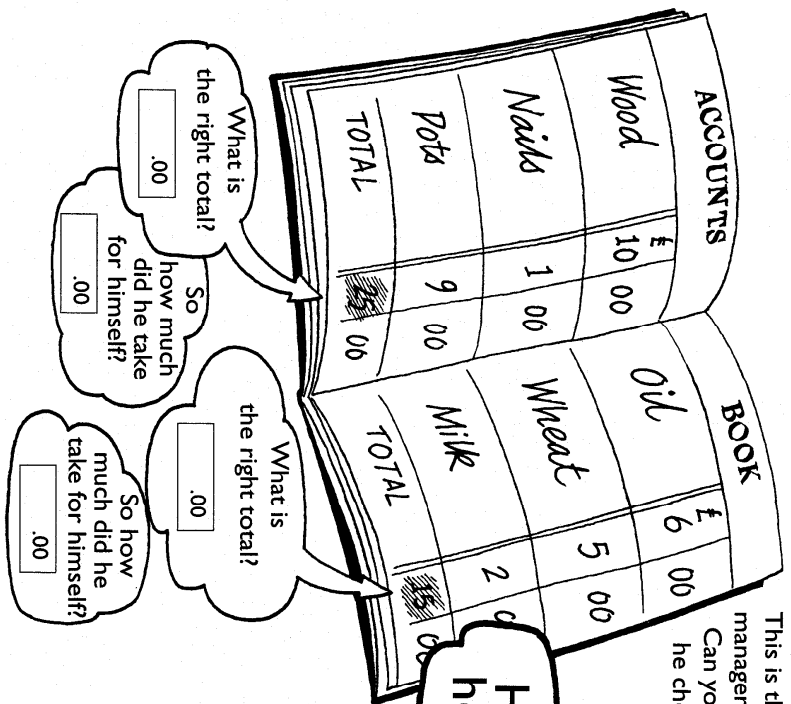
Whoever can be trusted with very little can also be trusted with much.
