MISSION TO GOD

This week as we come towards the end of our series on the mission of God's people we are looking at being people who are called to praise and prayer.

When we talk about praise and prayer we are not talking about the style of music in a church – whether hymns or songs, whether the organ or a band. We are not talking about the way we conduct our services and prayers whether liturgical or free-flowing. When we talk about being people who praise and pray we are considering what it means to be called to be people who bring glory to God by expressing our love for him and our commitment to being in relationship with him. There is no one way to do this. The important thing is that God is the focus of our prayer and praise.

We know God because he reveals himself to us. He does this in many different ways, through his creation, through his word, in the way he flows out of his people, in the ways he speaks to us through his church and in our private moments. The growing maturity of our faith depends upon how much we notice God in our lives and how deeply we respond to him. Our praise and our prayer is an expression of this notice and response. Bishop Augustine of Hippo wrote:

Too late have I loved You, O Beauty so ancient,
O Beauty so new, too late have I loved You!

You were within me but I was outside myself, and I sought You there!
In my weakness I ran after the beauty of the things You have made.
You were with me, and I was not with You.
The things You have made kept me from You —
the things which would have no being unless they existed in You!
You have called, You have cried out, and You have pierced my deafness.
You have radiated forth, and have shined
out brightly, and You have dispelled my blindness.
You have sent forth Your fragrance,
and I have breathed it in, and I long for You.
I have tasted You, and I hunger and thirst for You.
You have touched me, and I ardently desire Your peace.
(Augustine of Hippo, 354-430)

TWENTY-FIFTH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

FIRST READING

Jeremiah 29. 4-14

A reading from the book of Jeremiah

4Thus says the Lord of hosts, the God of Israel, to all the exiles whom I have sent into exile from Jerusalem to Babylon: 5Build houses and live in them; plant gardens and eat what they produce. Take wives and have sons and daughters; take wives for your sons, and give your daughters in marriage, that they may bear sons and daughters; multiply there, and do not decrease. 7But seek the welfare of the city where I have sent you into exile, and pray to the Lord on its behalf, for in its welfare you will find your welfare. 8For thus says the Lord of hosts, the God of Israel: Do not let the prophets and the diviners who are among you deceive you, and do not listen to the dreams that they dream, 9 for it is a lie that they are prophesying to you in my name; I did not send them, says the Lord. 10For thus says the Lord: Only when Babylon's seventy years are completed will I visit you, and I will fulfill to you my promise and bring you back to this place. 11For surely I know the plans I have for you, says the Lord, plans for your welfare and not for harm, to give you a future with hope. 12Then when you call upon me and come and pray to me, I will hear you. 13When you search for me, you will find me; if you seek me with all your heart, 141 will let you find me, says the Lord, and I will restore your fortunes and gather you from all the nations and all the places where I have driven you, says the Lord, and I will bring you back to the place from which I sent you into exile.

A reading from the book of Romans

⁵May the God of steadfastness and encouragement grant you to live in harmony with one another, in accordance with Christ Jesus, ⁶so that together you may with one voice glorify the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ. ⁷Welcome one another, therefore, just as Christ has welcomed

you, for the glory of God. 8For I tell you that Christ has become a servant of the circumcised on behalf of the truth of God in order that he might confirm the promises given to the patriarchs, ⁹and in order that the Gentiles might glorify God for his mercy. As it is written, "Therefore I will confess you among the Gentiles, and sing praises to your name"; ¹⁰and again he says, "Rejoice, O Gentiles, with his people"; ¹¹and again, "Praise the Lord, all you Gentiles, and let all the peoples praise him"; ¹²and again Isaiah says, "The root of Jesse shall come, the one who rises to rule the Gentiles; in him the Gentiles shall hope." ¹³May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace in believing, so that you may abound in hope by the power of the Holy Spirit.

The Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according Luke Chapter 11 commencing at verse 1.

Glory to you Lord Jesus Christ

He was praying in a certain place, and after he had finished, one of his disciples said to him, "Lord, teach us to pray, as John taught his disciples." ²He said to them, "When you pray, say: Father, hallowed be your name. Your kingdom come. ³Give us each day our daily bread. ⁴And forgive us our sins, for we ourselves forgive everyone indebted to us. And do not bring us to the time of trial." ⁵And he said to them, "Suppose one of you has a friend, and you go to him at midnight and say to him, 'Friend, lend me three loaves of bread; ⁶for a friend of mine has arrived, and I have nothing to set before him.' ⁷And he answers from within, 'Do not bother me; the door has already been locked, and my children are with me in bed; I cannot get up and give you anything.' ⁸I tell you, even though he will not get up and give him anything because he is his friend,

at least because of his persistence he will get up and give him whatever he needs. ⁹"So I say to you, Ask, and it will be given to you; search, and you will find; knock, and the door will be opened for you. ¹⁰For everyone who asks receives, and everyone who searches finds, and for everyone who knocks, the door will be opened. ¹¹Is there anyone among you who, if your child asks for a fish, will give a snake instead of a fish? ¹²Or if the child asks for an egg, will give a scorpion? ¹³If you then, who are evil, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will the heavenly Father give the Holy Spirit to those who ask him!"

Meagan began missionary life with ABM in 2002 as a teacher at Holy Name Secondary School, at Dogura, home of the Anglican Church of PNG (ACPNG) in Milne Bay Province.

After returning to Australia in 2004, she worked in government, completed her Masters in Public Health and was an active member of ABM's Board and Development Committee.

God called Meagan back to PNG in August 2009 for 2 ½ years to volunteer with Anglicare PNG in Port Moresby, supported by both Australian Volunteers International (AVI) and ABM. Then, from April 2013 until June 2016, Meagan worked as ABM's PNG Program Coordinator and Partner Liaison Officer, based initially in Port Moresby.

After marrying her husband, Nick, an Australian Lutheran Missionary, in February 2015, she moved to Goroka. They returned to Australia in May 2016 and welcomed their first daughter, Victoria, on 1 July.

Meagan returned to work with ABM as their Committee Support Officer in February 2017 and was appointed as the Key Relationships Manager in January 2022. She has happily balanced her part-time ABM work with life as the mother of a now 7 year old.

Meagan speaks regularly at parishes around Adelaide and at Synods and other Church gatherings around Australia. She loves sharing what God is doing through our partners and inviting Australian Anglicans to join in.
