This Sunday we begin our season of Advent - the four Sundays leading up to Christmas Day. The word 'advent' means the arrival or coming of a notable person or thing. In our church calendar Advent is the season in which we reflect upon the coming of Jesus Christ, our Lord and Saviour.

In this time of reflection we are encouraged to think of Jesus' coming in three way:

The birth of Jesus

Advent is certainly the time to think about the wonder, the extraordinary gift of the coming of Jesus to earth from the glory of heaven in the form of a helpless babe ... Jesus coming and offering his life for us on the cross so we could be reconciled to God - that is one aspect of 'coming';

The coming of the Holy Spirit

The second is the coming of Jesus into our lives here and now, we consider what it means that Jesus is a living God ... he died but death was not the end for him, he defeated death and rose again! and he comes to us today ... in power and in comfort and in healing ... right now ... and tomorrow and for all the days of our lives ... in the form of the holy spirit, when we invite him into our lives:

The second coming of Jesus

And the third aspect of Jesus' coming is that the story goes on ... this world is not the end of the story, it is not all that there is ... Jesus will come again to judge the living and the dead and he when he does he will bring his new and glorious kingdom to completion and this kingdom will have no end.

During advent we are encouraged to think about all three aspects of Jesus' coming and consider what these events mean for our lives now. Have we surrendered our lives to Jesus who gave his life to save us? Have we invited the Holy Spirit into our lives and allowed him to guide, comfort and care for us? Are we prepared for Jesus to come again and judge the world?

Reflecting upon these things draws us deeper into the worship of a God who loved us so much that he sent his only Son; it helps us to be filled with awe at the wonder of Jesus; and it increases our anticipation and longing for the fullness of the kingdom to dawn.

FIRST READING Isaiah 64.1–9

A reading from the book of Isaiah

¹ O that you would tear open the heavens and come down, so that the mountains would quake at your presence—2 as when fire kindles brushwood and the fire causes water to boil—to make your name known to your adversaries, so that the nations might tremble at your presence! 3 When you did awesome deeds that we did not expect, you came down, the mountains quaked at your presence.4 From ages past no one has heard, no ear has perceived, no eye has seen any God besides you, who works for those who wait for him. 5 You meet those who gladly do right, those who remember you in your ways. But you were angry, and we sinned; because you hid yourself we transgressed. ⁶ We have all become like one who is unclean, and all our righteous deeds are like a filthy cloth. We all fade like a leaf, and our iniquities, like the wind, take us away. 7 There is no one who calls on your name, or attempts to take hold of you; for you have hidden your face from us, and have delivered us into the hand of our iniquity. 8 Yet, O Lord, you are our Father; we are the clay, and you are our potter; we are all the work of your hand. 9 Do not be exceedingly angry, O Lord, and do not remember iniquity for ever. Now consider, we are all your people.

1 Corinthians 1.1–9

A reading from the first letter to the Corinthians

¹ Paul, called to be an apostle of Christ Jesus by the will of God, and our brother Sosthenes, ² To the church of God that is in Corinth, to those who are sanctified in Christ Jesus, called to be saints, together with all those who in every place call on the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, both their Lord and ours: ³ Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ. ⁴ I give thanks to my God always for you because of the grace of God that has been given you in Christ Jesus, ⁵ for in every way you have been enriched in him, in speech and knowledge of every kind— ⁶ just as the testimony of Christ has been strengthened among you— ⁷ so that you are not lacking in any spiritual gift as you wait for the revealing of our Lord Jesus Christ. ⁸ He will also strengthen you to the end,

so that you may be blameless on the day of our Lord Jesus Christ. ⁹ God is faithful; by him you were called into the fellowship of his Son, Jesus Christ our Lord.

The Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according Mark Chapter 13 commencing at verse 24.

Glory to you Lord Jesus Christ

²⁴ 'But in those days, after that suffering, the sun will be darkened, and the moon will not give its light, 25 and the stars will be falling from heaven, and the powers in the heavens will be shaken. ²⁶ Then they will see "the Son of Man coming in clouds" with great power and glory. ²⁷ Then he will send out the angels, and gather his elect from the four winds, from the ends of the earth to the ends of heaven. ²⁸ 'From the fig tree learn its lesson: as soon as its branch becomes tender and puts forth its leaves, you know that summer is near. ²⁹ So also, when you see these things taking place, you know that he is near, at the very gates. ³⁰ Truly I tell you, this generation will not pass away until all these things have taken place. 31 Heaven and earth will pass away, but my words will not pass away. 32 'But about that day or hour no one knows, neither the angels in heaven, nor the Son, but only the Father. 33 Beware, keep alert; for you do not know when the time will come. 34 It is like a man going on a journey, when he leaves home and puts his slaves in charge, each with his work, and commands the doorkeeper to be on the watch. 35 Therefore, keep awake—for you do not know when the master of the house will come, in the evening, or at

midnight, or at cockcrow, or at dawn, ³⁶ or else he may find you asleep when he comes suddenly. ³⁷ And what I say to you I say to all: Keep awake.'
