

Christmas PP's

Our One of our favourite Christmas carols in the Anglican Church is O Holy Night. There is a wonderful line in the carol which recognises that Jesus comes into a weary world. For many of us, this is true. We have lived with fear and uncertainty and change for many years, and it is exhausting. Trying to remain positive and joyful when we see and experience so much tragedy all around us is hard.

But the carol goes on to remind us that we have a Saviour Jesus. It encourages us to rejoice and to feel the thrill of hope because all the burdens of the world are not up to us to fix on our own.

In Luke's gospel we are told that Jesus was born at the time when Caesar Augustus ruled the Roman Empire. Caesar Augustus was a powerful ruler and he called himself a god and saviour. There is an ancient inscription, called the Priene calendar inscription, dated around 9BC (so a few years before Jesus was born), which claims that Augustus was the 'good news' and the one who would bring peace and salvation for his people. Amazingly, these are the very claims that the bible makes about Jesus. We are told that Jesus is God's son, our saviour and the good news of salvation for the world.

When we push God aside and decide to do things our own way, we also take on all the burdens of the world. We feel it is up to us to bring the joy and peace and hope of Christmas. Like Caesar Augustus in the bible story, we think we are the good news! But we're not. The true message of Christmas is about Jesus. Jesus is the one who brings us joy, makes peace for us and gives us hope for the future.

The wonder and the beauty of Christmas is not up to us. We do not have to exhaust ourselves buying or cooking or decorating the Christmas spirit. The

wonder and beauty of Christmas is the unexpected, unmerited and love laden gift of our Saviour Jesus. In the middle of this weary world, take some rest in Him this Christmas.

CHRISTMAS DAY

SENTENCE:

I bring you good news of great joy for all people: to you is born this day in the city of David a Saviour, Christ the Lord. Luke 2.10–11.

FIRST READING Isaiah 62.6-12

A reading from the book of Isaiah

⁶ Upon your walls, O Jerusalem, I have posted sentinels; all day and all night they shall never be silent. You who remind the Lord, take no rest, ⁷ and give him no rest until he establishes Jerusalem and makes it renowned throughout the earth. ⁸ The Lord has sworn by his right hand and by his mighty arm: will not again give your grain to be food for your enemies, and foreigners shall not drink the wine for which you have laboured; ⁹ but those who garner it shall eat it and praise the Lord, and those who gather it shall drink it in my holy courts. ¹⁰ Go through, go through the gates, prepare the way for the people; build up, build up the highway, clear it of stones, lift up an ensign over the peoples. ¹¹ The Lord has proclaimed to the end of the earth: Say to daughter Zion, 'See, your salvation comes; his reward is with him, and his recompense before him.' ¹² They shall be called, 'The Holy People, The Redeemed of the Lord'; and you shall be called, 'Sought Out, A City Not Forsaken.'.

PSALM 97

The Lord is king; let the earth rejoice: let the multitude of islands be glad.

- 2 Clouds and darkness are round about him: righteousness and justice are the foundation of his throne.
- 3 Fire goes before him: and burns up his enemies on every side.
- 4 His lightnings light the world: the earth sees it and quakes.
- 5 The mountains melt like wax before his face: from before the face of the Lord of all the earth.
- The heavens have proclaimed his righteousness: and all peoples have seen his glory.
- 7 They are ashamed, all those who serve idols and glory in mere nothings: all gods bow down before him.
- 8 Zion heard and was glad, and the daughters of Judah rejoiced: **because of your judgements, O God.**
- 9 For you, Lord, are most high over all the earth: you are exalted far above all gods.
- 10 The Lord loves those that hate evil:
 the Lord guards the life of the faithful,
 and delivers them from the hand of the ungodly.
- 11 Light dawns for the righteous: and joy for the true of heart.
- 12 Rejoice in the Lord, you righteous: and give thanks to his holy name.

SECOND READING Titus 3.4-8a

A reading from the book of Titus

⁴ But when the goodness and loving-kindness of God our Saviour appeared, ⁵ he saved us, not because of any works of righteousness that we had done, but according to his mercy, through the water of rebirth and renewal by the Holy Spirit. ⁶ This Spirit he poured out on us richly through Jesus Christ our Saviour, ⁷ so that, having been justified by his grace, we might become heirs according to the hope of eternal life. ⁸ The saying is sure. I desire that you insist on these things, so that those who have come to believe in God may be careful to devote themselves to good works; these things are excellent and profitable to everyone.

Gospel Luke 2.1-20

The Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according Luke Chapter 2 commencing at verse 20.

Glory to you Lord Jesus Christ

1 In those days a decree went out from Emperor Augustus that all the world should be registered. ² This was the first registration and was taken while Quirinius was governor of Syria. 3 All went to their own towns to be registered. ⁴ Joseph also went from the town of Nazareth in Galilee to Judea, to the city of David called Bethlehem, because he was descended from the house and family of David. 5 He went to be registered with Mary, to whom he was engaged and who was expecting a child. ⁶ While they were there, the time came for her to deliver her child. ⁷ And she gave birth to her firstborn son and wrapped him in bands of cloth, and laid him in a manger, because there was no place for them in the inn. 8 In that region there were shepherds living in the fields, keeping watch over their flock by night. 9 Then an angel of the Lord stood before them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were terrified. 10 But the angel said to them, 'Do not be afraid; for see—I am bringing you good news of great joy for all the people: 11 to you is born this day in the city of David a Saviour, who is the Messiah, the Lord. 12 This will be a sign for you: you will find a child wrapped in bands of cloth and lying in a manger.' 13 And suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host, praising God and saying, 14 'Glory to God in the highest heaven, and on earth peace among those whom he favours!' 15 When the angels had left them and gone into heaven, the shepherds said to one another, 'Let us go now to Bethlehem and see this thing that has taken place, which the Lord has made known to us.' 16 So they went with haste and found Mary and Joseph, and the child lying in the manger.¹⁷ When they saw this, they made known what

had been told them about this child; ¹⁸ and all who heard it were amazed at what the shepherds told them. ¹⁹ But Mary treasured all these words and pondered them in her heart. ²⁰ The shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God for all they had heard and seen, as it had been told them.


