Reflection

At dawn on the 25th April 1915, 90 years ago Australian and New Zealand soldiers landed at what we now know as Anzac Cove on the Gallipoli Peninsula. The campaign was plagued by ill-defined goals, poor planning, insufficient and inadequate equipment, and tactical deficiencies. The campaign which was to last nearly 8 months was defined as a military failure.

But the Australian soldiers' behaviour, bravery, ingenuity, endurance and mateship under horrific conditions are now thought of as a defining aspect of the Australian character. By November 1915, the British war office decided to evacuate the peninsula as the objective could not be achieved. The evacuation was started on the 15th December and completed on the 20th of December and it is now regarded as the best planned part of the venture. The soldiers, on leaving, felt guilty leaving behind their mates who had made the ultimate sacrifice. Little did they know that some of them were to face more horrific conditions on the western front in France.

An extract of a special message attributed to Mustafa Kemal Ataturk in 1934:

Those heroes who shed their blood and lost their lives! You are now lying in the soil of a friendly country. Therefore rest in peace. There is no difference between the Johnnies and Mehmet's to us where they lie side by side here in this country to of ours. You, the mothers, who sent their sons from far away countries wipe away your tears; your sons are now lying in our bosom and are in peace. After having lost their lives on this land they have become our sons as well.

An extract from the poem - "Arras Road' by Laurence Binyon'

There in the dark, on either side The road, are all the brave who died I think not on the battles won I think of those whose day is done.

A prayer for peace:

Loving God Grant us peace in our time and a longing For the day when people of every nation and race Will be brought into of Christ's kingdom. Amen
