Jesus said, 'You did not choose me, but I chose you. And I appointed you to go and bear fruit.' John 15.16

When Jesus spoke these words to his disciples it is most likely that he was speaking about choosing the disciples to live a particular life — one which bears fruit, rather than it being a general comment about eternal life.

When we hear these words in our own context, we need to hear them in the same way. The passage is telling us that Jesus has chosen the people of his church to bear fruit.

Bearing fruit is about living lives of love - loving God and loving each other - and drawing others to Jesus.

The bible tells us that Jesus helps us to bear fruit by 'abiding' in Him. This means having a personal, relational connection with Jesus. Abiding has a real experiential element to it where we feel connected to Jesus; we feel the love of Jesus flowing through us.

Discipleship is not just about knowledge of God and the bible and it is not just about being a good person and doing good deeds. This passage is reminding us that discipleship is about being in relationship with Jesus. It is about allowing his love to nourish and encourage us and overflow from us into love for each other. When we abide in Jesus, we draw close to him and we experience the feeling of being loved completely by him. We are then able to love others with this same sacrificial generosity.

SENTENCE:

FIRST READING Acts 10.44-48

A reading from the book of Acts

44 While Peter was still speaking, the Holy Spirit fell upon all who heard the word. 45 The circumcised believers who had come with Peter were astounded that the gift of the Holy Spirit had been poured out even on the Gentiles, 46 for they heard them speaking in tongues and extolling God. Then Peter said, 47 'Can anyone withhold the water for baptising these people who have received the Holy Spirit just as we have?' 48 So he ordered them to be baptised in the name of Jesus Christ. Then they invited him to stay for several days.

SECOND READING 1 John 5.1-12

A reading from the first book of John

¹ Everyone who believes that Jesus is the Christ has been born of God, and everyone who loves the parent loves the child. ² By this we know that we love the children of God, when we love God and obey his commandments. ³ For the love of God is this, that we obey his commandments. And his commandments are not burdensome, 4 for whatever is born of God conquers the world. And this is the victory that conquers the world, our faith. 5 Who is it that conquers the world but the one who believes that Jesus is the Son of God? 6 This is the one who came by water and blood, Jesus Christ, not with the water only but with the water and the blood. And the Spirit is the one that testifies, for the Spirit is the truth. 7 There are three that testify: 8 the Spirit and the water and the blood, and these three agree. 9 If we receive human testimony, the testimony of God is greater; for this is the testimony of God that he has testified to his Son. 10 Those who believe in the Son of God have the testimony in their hearts. Those who do not believe in God have made him a liar by not believing in the testimony that God has given concerning his Son. 11 And this is the testimony: God gave us eternal life, and this life is in his Son. 12 Whoever has the Son has life; whoever does not have the Son of God does not have life.
