James (Jim) Charles Martin was born in Tocumwal in southern N.S.W. to Charles and Amelia Martin, their only son and brother to 5 sisters. At the outbreak of W.W.1 James was a member of the school cadets, and after his father was rejected on medical grounds, James said "do not worry Dad I will go instead", if you wont let me go I will run away and join up under another name.

Charles and Amelia after much discussion gave their consent to James to enlistment. After initial training at Broadmeadows training camp James boarded the troop ship 'Berrima' on route to Egypt for further training.

He was then boarded the troop ship 'Southlander' on route to Gallipoli the ship was torpedoed by a German submarine and James spent some hours in the water until picked up by a French Red cross patrol boat and taken to Mudros Island and then onto Gallipoli .

On landing at Gallipoli James and his company were stationed at 'Courtneys Post' one of the most dangerous places on the peninsula.

Due to the intense heat, flies, poor sanitary conditions and the stench on the battlefield James developed typhoid and lost nearly half his body weight. He was taken aboard the hospital ship 'Glenart Castle" and cared for by Matron Reddick. He asked the matron 'will I recover she said we will have you up and about in no time..

James died at 6.40am on the 25th October 1915 and was buried at sea by chaplain Reverend Barker. James was only 14yrs and 9months at the time of his death. His few personal items which included his 'aluminium dog tag' some letters, money belt and his new testament were returned to his mother Amelia.

In ocean waters no poppies grow
No crosses stand in ordered row
There young hearts sleep beneath the waves
The spirited, the good the brave
But stars a constant keep
For them that lie beneath the deep.
Tis true you cannot kneel to pray.
On certain spot and think he's here
But you can to the ocean's go,
Can dry your tears and pray for those,
Who rest beneath the heaving seas.
