In the second week of our three part series on understanding the bible better, we are looking at how the bible shapes our lives as God's people.

In the opening book – Genesis, and the final book - Revelation, the bible is bookended with the story of a loving God who creates and then recreates a beautiful, fruitful world. God fills this world with abundant life and blesses us by calling us to participate with him in the ongoing creative care and nurture of this world. In Genesis we see humanity being invited join with God to plant, produce, procreate (Gensis 1.26-31). In Revelation an invitation is extended to 'come' and continue to bring forth fruit, and govern with God forever (Revelation 20-22).

Throughout the bible we are being taught about our role in living out God's will and bringing his kingdom to earth. Now, as we await Christ's coming again, God calls us to participate with him in re-creating a beautiful, just, fruitful, peaceable world. The bible invites us to worship God in awe and action; to be his salt and light in the world and participate with Him in the restoration of goodness and justice. We are to make the vision of heaven a reality here and now.

The bible guides us to understand that our worship, our purpose, our spirituality:

is not just about sitting in a room encountering a mystical god in meditation or about seeing God in a sunset. Awe is the gateway to compassion. It is a deep awareness that we are creators, creators who work with the Creator, in an ongoing project of crafting a world. If we do not like the world or are afraid of it, we have had a hand in that. And if we made a mess, we can clean it up and do better.

TWENTIETH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

SENTENCE:

Sing to the Lord, all the earth, proclaim his salvation, declare his glory. For great is the Lord and most worthy of praise! 1 Chronicles 16.23

PRAYER OF THE DAY:

Almighty God, you have created the heavens and the earth and made us in your own image: teach us to discern your hand in all your works and your likeness in all your children; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, who with you and the Holy Spirit reigns supreme over all things, now and for ever. Amen.

FIRST READING

1 Chronicles 16.7-36

- 7 That day David first appointed Asaph and his associates to give praise to the Lord in this manner:
- 8 Give praise to the Lord, proclaim his name; make known among the nations what he has done.

9 Sing to him, sing praise to him; tell of all his wonderful acts.

- 10 Glory in his holy name; let the hearts of those who seek the Lord rejoice.
- 11 Look to the Lord and his strength; seek his face always.
- 12 Remember the wonders he has done, his miracles, and the judgments he pronounced,
- 13 you his servants, the descendants of Israel, his chosen ones, the children of Jacob.
- 14 He is the Lord our God; his judgments are in all the earth.
- 15 He remembers his covenant forever, the promise he made, for a thousand generations,
- 16 the covenant he made with Abraham, the oath he swore to Isaac.

- 17 He confirmed it to Jacob as a decree, to Israel as an everlasting covenant:
- 18 "To you I will give the land of Canaan as the portion you will inherit."
- 19 When they were but few in number, few indeed, and strangers in it,
- 20 they wandered from nation to nation, from one kingdom to another.
- 21 He allowed no one to oppress them; for their sake he rebuked kings:
- 22 "Do not touch my anointed ones; do my prophets no harm."
- 23 Sing to the Lord, all the earth; proclaim his salvation day after day.
- 24 Declare his glory among the nations, his marvelous deeds among all peoples.
- 25 For great is the Lord and most worthy of praise; he is to be feared above all gods.
- 26 For all the gods of the nations are idols, but the Lord made the heavens.
- 27 Splendor and majesty are before him; strength and joy are in his dwelling place.
- 28 Ascribe to the Lord, all you families of nations, ascribe to the Lord glory and strength.
- Ascribe to the Lord the glory due his name;
 bring an offering and come before him.
 Worship the Lord in the splendor of his holiness.
- 30 Tremble before him, all the earth! The world is firmly established; it cannot be moved.
- 31 Let the heavens rejoice, let the earth be glad; let them say among the nations, "The Lord reigns!"
- 32 Let the sea resound, and all that is in it; let the fields be jubilant, and everything in them!
- Let the trees of the forest sing,
 let them sing for joy before the Lord,
 for he comes to judge the earth.
- 34 Give thanks to the Lord, for he is good; his love endures forever.

- Cry out, "Save us, God our Savior; 35 gather us and deliver us from the nations, that we may give thanks to your holy name, and glory in your praise."
- 36 Praise be to the Lord, the God of Israel, from everlasting to everlasting.

Then all the people said "Amen" and "Praise the Lord."

SECOND READING

Romans 12.1-2

A reading from the book of Romans

¹Therefore, I urge you, brothers and sisters, in view of God's mercy, to offer your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and pleasing to God—this is your true and proper worship. ²Do not conform to the pattern of this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind. Then you will be able to test and approve what God's will is—his good, pleasing and perfect will.

Glory to you Lord Jesus Christ
